You need to put them in order.

Schools don't find out what order you've put them in.

Religious schools will need supporting documents.

For Catholic applicants: If you attend Mass in more than one Church, please submit a separate copy of a Priest Reference Form for each parish. Please include copy of your daughter's baptism certificate.

For applicants of other Christian denominations and for all other faiths, please hand the Faith Leader Reference Form to your vicar, minister or faith leader. For all Christian applicants evidence of baptism or certificate of dedication will be required.

NB: For entry into all years, you **MUST also complete and return a Common Application Form to your Local Authority.**

Example of the kind of information required by religious school.

Children are expected to have been baptised and regularly attend church.

How often do you attend Mass:

- weekly**
(ranking priority level 1)
- fortnightly**
(ranking priority level 2)
- at least once a month**
(ranking priority level 3)
- less often**
(ranking priority level 4)

How it works:

- Schools decide if they can offer you a place.
- You are then offered a place at the highest school on your list that has a place for you.
- Your application to join schools lower down your list is then automatically withdrawn.
- You are automatically placed on the waiting list for schools higher up your list which you haven't been offered a place at.

Useful tips:

Put down as many schools as you can.

If you only put down one, it doesn't make you more likely to get it.

If you don't get a place at any of the schools you've chosen, a school will be chosen for you.

Some schools have sibling links.

For example:

If you have a boy already at Coombe Boys', your daughter will be given priority for Coombe Girls'.

Be realistic about:

- Your child's chances of getting into grammar school.
- Your child's chance of getting into a church school if you are not religious.
- Your child's chance of getting into a school which is a long way away.

Advice

Visit schools (if possible)

Talk to parents with children at the school

Be realistic

Ask for help if you need it
