

# Reading at Burlington Junior School

- Lower School

Children should be reading at home for 15 minutes every day.

They should record their reading in their reading diaries, including the page numbers they have read.





# Reading at Burlington Junior School

#### - Lower School

Children on the school reading scheme or Read Write Inc will have a book at the appropriate level to take home.

Collins books help with comprehension and expanding vocabulary and should be discussed with an adult. There are helpful questions in the planners.

They can take home another book at a higher level to share with an adult.





# Reading at Burlington Junior School

### - Lower School

If your child needs support with their phonics, they will take home a Read Write Inc book bag book. This will be their reading book from school.

They can read their library book with an adult at home.



## Reading diaries



- Should be filled in daily and shown to your teacher/TA
- Book name and pages
- Can be filled in by child or grown up that is reading with the child
- Should be initialled by an adult
- Notes can go into diaries



# Writing at Burlington Junior School



### - Lower School

Children have lots of chances to write over a week at Burlington - not just in English.

Children earn a pen licence by producing 5 pieces of good handwriting in pencil.

Children can lose their pen licence if their handwriting isn't good enough.

Handwriting interventions for any child who needs it.

Teachers assess children's writing over the year.

Real life writing opportunities - email family, write a diary, writing for pleasure.

This won't suit all children - don't force writing at home if they're not enjoying it.

#### Talk!

Ask your child about what they're writing at school.

#### Read!


The more children read, the better their writing will be.


#### The Wider Curriculum

# Home Learning at Burlington Junior School



#### Every week you **MUST** complete the following home learning tasks:

#### **Spelling**

- Learn and practise the spellings you have been given (these are on Google Classroom). The page at the back of your diaries may help you. Share your spelling practice with grown ups at home.
- You will be tested on these spellings during Friday's dictation.
- Do you know what these words mean?
- Can you use them in a sentence?
- What are the word's synonyms and antonyms?

#### Reading

- Read every day for 15 minutes.
- If you have one, read your coloured reading book out loud to someone at home at least three times a week.
- Update your reading diary every day with a comment about your reading.
- Can you add a new book to your 'book bingo' page in your diaries?

#### **Maths**

- Use <u>TT Rockstars</u> to learn and continue to practise times tables up to 12 x 12 (including division facts).
- Complete the <u>Mathletics</u> homework tasks that you have been set.

**Visit:** Your local library and see if you can find any non fiction books about light and dark. Can you find any fiction books with a magical theme?




# Google Classroom
