#### Dear Headteacher,

Thank you for all the work that has gone in to rolling out the Mayor's Universal Free School Meals programme this term.

It is testament to you and your colleagues that an extra 287,000 primary school children can now access a free school meal. We have heard from children and parents across the city about how much it already helping them. This could not have been possible without the dedication of you and your staff.

Please see below details of a Challenge for your pupils which we hope presents an exciting opportunity, as well as information regarding ongoing support for the programme from City Hall.

#### The Mayor's "Love your Lunches" School Challenge

This week the Mayor launched his "Love your Lunches" Schools Challenge. The Challenge invites London's school children in Years 3 to 6 to celebrate all that is amazing about school lunches by making a creative piece of work on the theme 'The best thing about school lunches is...'.

By entering the challenge, pupils will have the chance for their work to feature on the Mayor of London's communications platforms with further fantastic prizes to be announced shortly. Updates will be posted online.

We hope that this is an exciting opportunity for children to showcase what they enjoy about their free school lunch, and what it means for them. Through the Challenge we want to centre children's voices and perspectives. We also want to encourage them to be as creative as possible; entries could be a piece of artwork, a poem, a story, or even a song.
