The best way to protect children against measles is to ensure that they have had two doses of the MMR vaccine.

To see if your child is up to date with their MMR vaccines, check your child's red book or contact your GP practice. If your child is not up to date, you can either book an appointment:

• at your GP practice, or at a local vaccine clinic.
