## **Burlington Sports Vision**

- All children to maintain a lifelong healthy and active lifestyle.
- To develop all children's physical and mental ability.
- To enable all children to challenge themselves to participate in extra-curricular activities.

#### **Funding**

Each primary school received £16,000 plus £10 per pupil to help increase PE expertise in school. The funding is ring-fenced for P.E. Schools must develop teacher expertise in order to improve the quality of their PE teaching. In total, Burlington Junior School will receive £20,780 in 2023-2024.
