Feedback

What's working well:

- * New building has really improved the school.
- * Separate music room and more play space will be really good.
- * Bigger classes and less noise – classrooms much better than before!
- * Class Whatsapp works well for reminders.
- * Pick up and drop off working well in new building.
- * The teachers are doing a great job in the classroom and children are enjoying classes.
- * Google classroom is working well.
- * The boundary set for parents to walk around for pick up and drop off is working well.



Feedback

Even better if:

- * Better communication in general.
- * More offline/paper-based homework.
- * Change the clubs process so it's fairer – have a separate google form going live at 8pm, then use that to choose people on first come first served and do payment on gateway.
- * In some cases, choose different people each term when a club is popular – for instance, gardening club.
