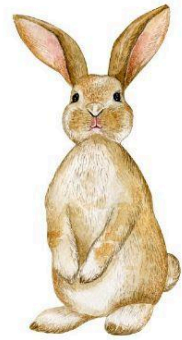
Thursday 12th February at 2pm. **Please note that there has been a slight change to the timings due to an extra presentation.**
